
Establishing the Theme on 'WordPress'

In order to start making the website in 'WordPress', a theme was required of which the other developer had created and then in the 'style.css' file the other developer entered details of the theme which are viewable below.

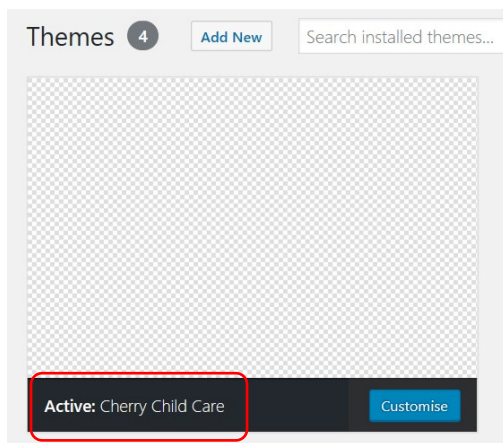

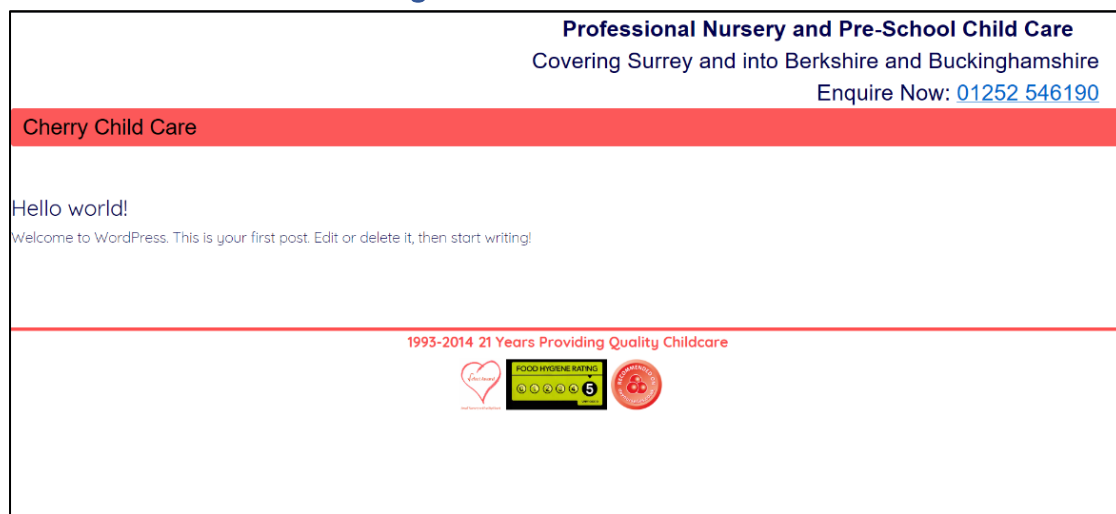
To begin, it was decided that I would change the 'footer.php' file so that it matched the design of the website created in the previous semester.



The Actual Created Pages



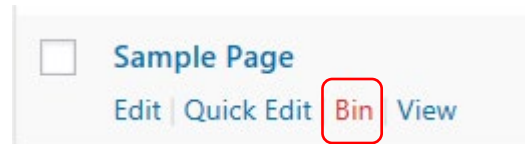

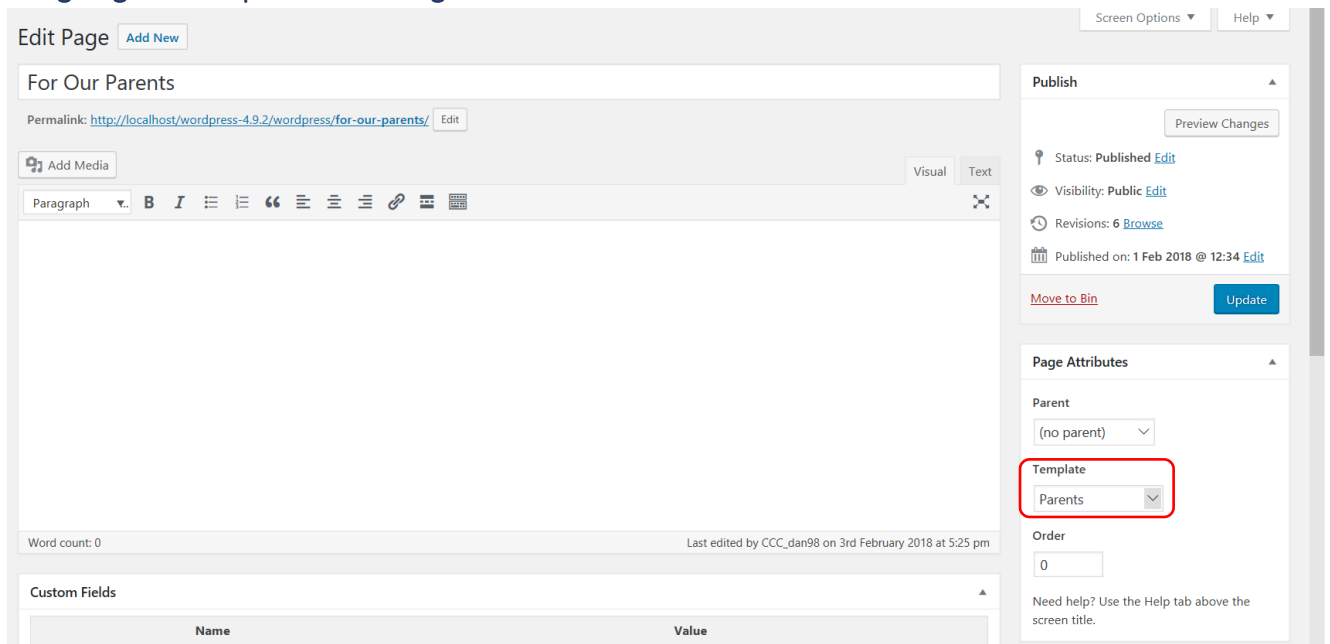




Changing the Method of Implementing Custom Fields

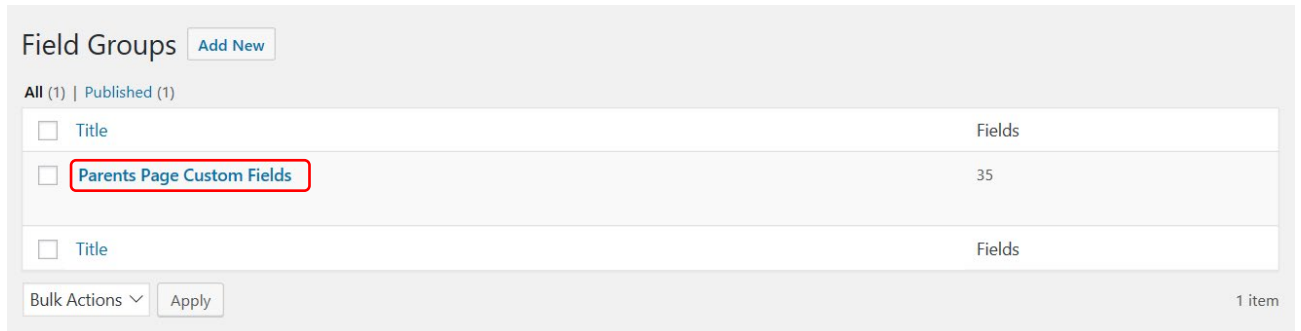
Setting up the Advanced Custom Fields for the Parents Page

The Created Custom Fields Group for the Parents Page



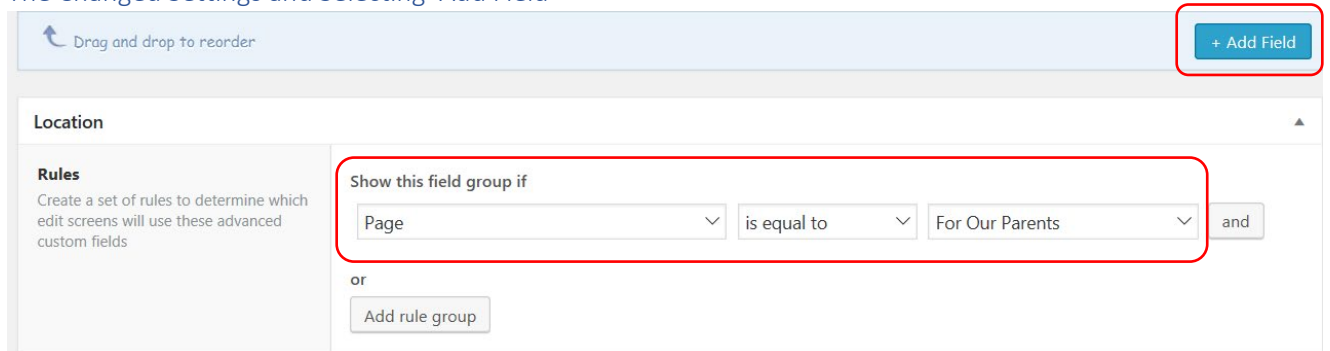
Changing Settings of the Custom Fields Group

As told by the other developer, I had to change a few settings with regards to the custom fields group. I had to change it so that the custom fields would have appeared on the parents page. This was done by selecting 'Page', 'is equal to' and 'For Our Parents'.

To add a new field in this group, I first had to select 'Add Field' and then enter in some data.

A field label, name and type were required as well as implementing any instructions which would have made it easier for the client to understand what they would have had to do. 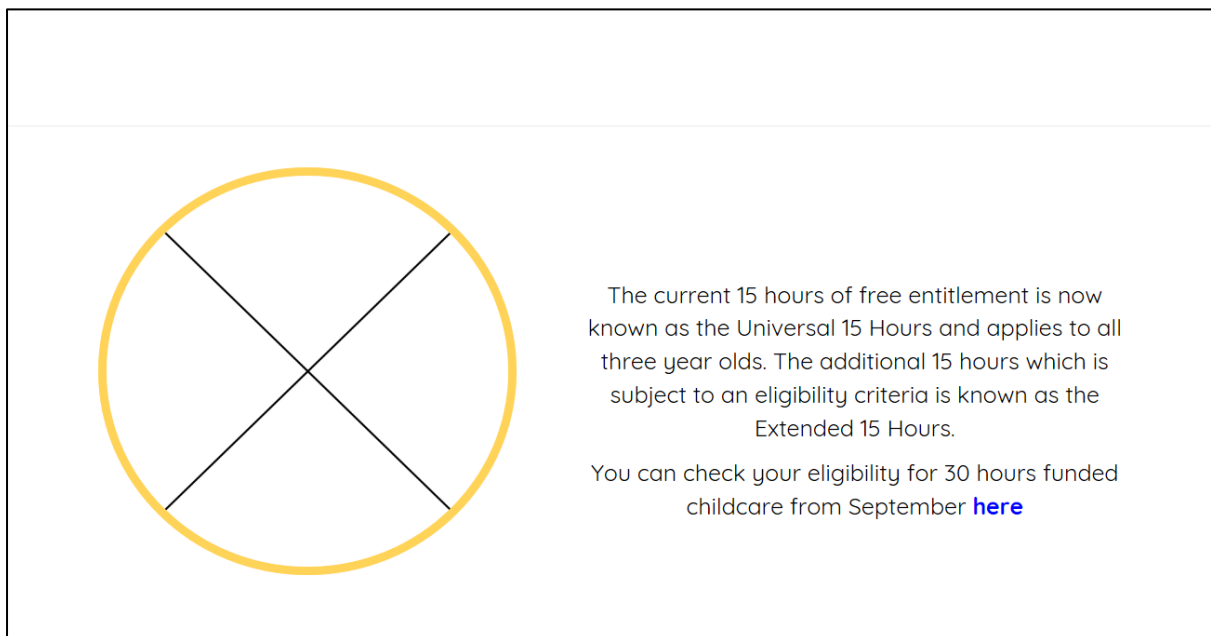
There was an issue with attempting to get the '30 Hours Funded Childcare Title' field to work and for a while it was inconclusive to what could have been causing the error shown below. This appeared when I had typed a value into the field and clicked 'update'. It had erased the value and automatically entered '44' which caused the web page to appear as can be seen below.

I then viewed the code to see if there were any problems. I noticed that on the custom field I had created, the 'ID' didn't match that of the one in the code which therefore caused it to malfunction.

Establishing the Image Fields (Example)

Introduction/Overview

In order to add image fields to the parents page, I was taught how to by the other developer. First of all, I added in a new field on the custom fields page. As can be seen below, I first of all added in a field label which would have appeared as a title of the field on the parents page and then also added in a field name which would have corresponded to the code. The field type was set to image and I was advised to set the 'Return Value' to 'Image URL' by the other developer. Everything else was left as default.

The 'alt' tag was added in as inspired by the other developer to do so. Once the field had been established, this then appeared on the parents page.

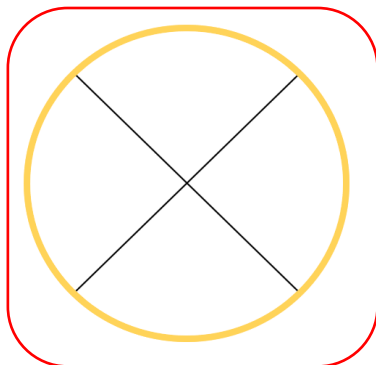



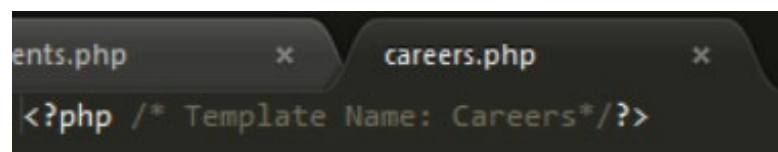

There was an issue that appeared with regards to the 'menus' section as the 'CherryVale' page had automatically been added after I had created the page which caused it to appear on the menu.






As the individual nursery pages would have been separate to the main nursery page and because they would have had their own microsites, this meant that I wanted to create a separate navigation menu for this.

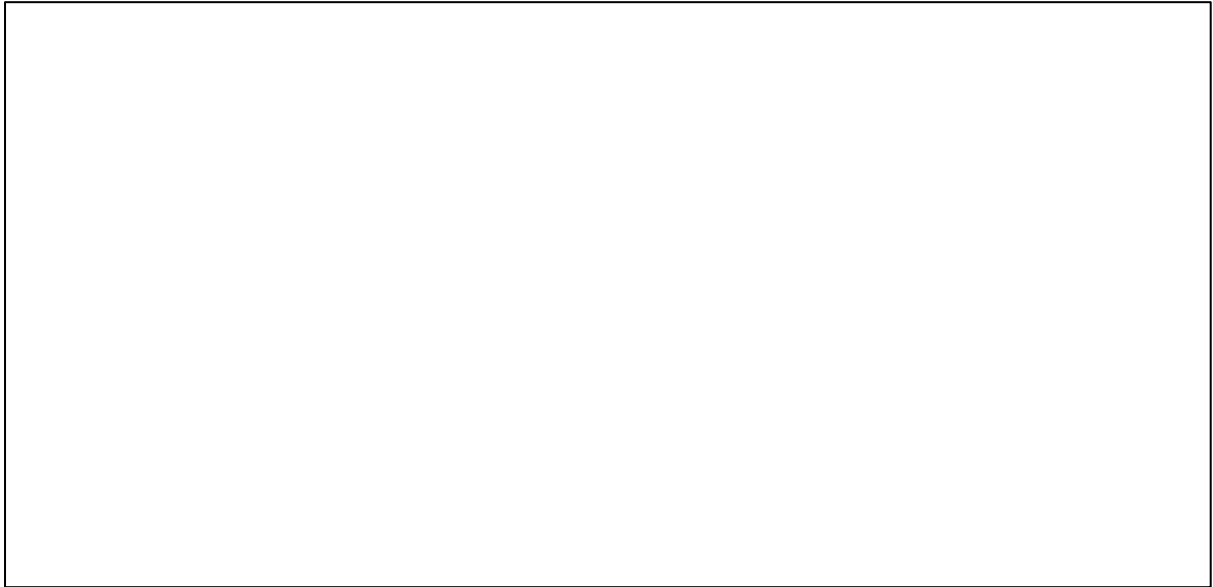

Undertaking a Process Previously

Introduction/Overview

Before attempting the process above, I created a new menu in preparation for the individual nursery pages. As is evident I named the menu 'individual_nursery_menu' which I would have then attempted to link to the 'individual_nursery_header.php' file. However, at this stage, I was yet to add the pages into the menu as I didn't have many pages to add to it.

I then saved the menu below and after the process of trying to create a new header for the individual pages for each nursery, I thought it would have been beneficial to have the menu on each individual nursery page where custom fields could have been utilised to change the links. This was because I couldn't find a solution to the problem I was experiencing but also due to the fact that I thought there may have been some issues due to the fact that the links had to change for each page.

After I had thought of the idea above, I then created pages for all of the individual nursery pages and added the template which was added to the 'CherryVale' page so that the format would have been the same for each page.

I did experience the same problem as before which was where the pages were automatically added to the menu. As explained before, I then removed the item from the menu and this time I unticked the 'Automatically add new top-level pages to this menu'. This would have meant that I would have had to have manually added the items to the menu if I wanted to. This process was repeated for all of the items in the menu. This then solved the issue.

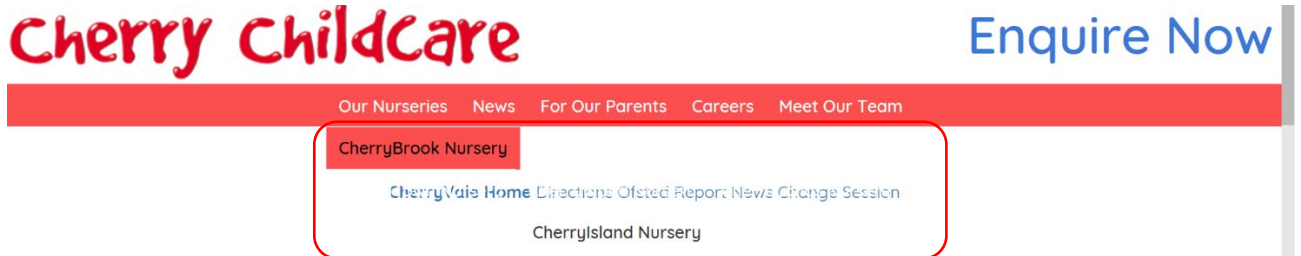


Introduction/Overview



The Final Approach at this Stage


Introduction/Overview

As will be seen below, I added custom fields to the links for the method I was undertaking at the current time which would have allowed for changing of these links for each individual nursery page. From viewing the advanced custom fields options, I realised that page links could have been added which would have allowed for a link to go to a specific created page on 'WordPress'.

This then appeared in the custom fields section on the individual nursery pages as will also be seen below which would have allowed for selecting which page the link would have navigated to when selected.

To add the link to an external page, for example for the directions and 'OFSTED', I copied the code within the file and pasted it into the text field as I couldn't find another method of doing so. This wasn't very user friendly but to compensate for this, it was decided that instructions would have been implemented later on in the project to explain how to change this.
